WHO SHOULD ATTEND

If you are a physician, nurse, patient, family member, health care worker, social worker, chaplain or adult care home administrator, you are affected by ethical decisions in health care. Ethical dilemmas can occur in the delivery of health care with decisions about end-of-life care, cost of care, honoring religious decisions of patients, and the use of technology in today's health care delivery.

This health care ethics conference is structured to stimulate discussion of real life ethical issues.

Healthcare professionals as well as the general public can benefit by joining the discussion at this conference.

Objectives

At the conclusion of the conference participants will be able to:

- *Analyze and formulate an informed opinion on the ethical implications of compulsory substance use treatment .*
- *Recognize the importance of a trauma-informed approach with human trafficking and sexual assault survivors. Describe ethical obligations health care professionals have in caring for human trafficking survivors.*
- *Raise and discuss ethical issues that arise when confronting the problems of elder abuse and elder self-neglect.*
- *Evaluate the impact stemming from large numbers of seniors and their adult children who have failed to educate themselves about the aging process on the country and our healthcare system*
- *Differentiate sources of online health information. Understand the role and ethical dimensions of online health information in the patient-provider relationship. Employ online health information resources to support shared -decision making.*
- *Identify trajectories of illness that signal planning for serious illness conversations.*


Speakers:

She graduated in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in Nursing from Wichita State University. Tina, along with her coworkers, have been recognized by the Wichita Police Department Chief of Police for service rendered to the community and citizens of the City of Wichita regarding vulnerable populations. She is certified as a sexual assault nurse examiner for adult, adolescent, and pediatric patients. She is also a nurse examiner caring for patients who are victims of domestic violence, child abuse, elder abuse, interpersonal violence and human trafficking. Tina was recently recognized by U.S. Attorney, District of Kansas Barry Grissom for the implementation of a protocol for medical providers on how to identify and respond to victims of human trafficking in the healthcare setting.

Earlier this year, the Sunflower Foundation awarded the Center a grant to support Kathy's work on elder abuse prevention and response.


