Each year, the Maternal Child Nursing Symposium seeks to expand our knowledge in women's, infant's and children's health care. The symposium features national and local speakers presenting on current obstetric and neonatal/pediatric topics. This year we have nationally known speaker Catherine Ruhl, MS, CNM, Director of the Women's Health Programs for Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN). Cathy, a Kansas native and KU graduate, will share her expertise on the AWHONN Maternal Fetal Triage Index, the hormonal physiology of childbearing, and alcohol use in pregnancy. Cathy is excited to return to her roots in Kansas and speak!

When children experience chronic illness, they have much more going on than just the illness itself. Dr. Kelli Netson-Amore, pediatric neuropsychologist, will identify common psychological complications of children experiencing chronic illness and behavioral interventions that are designed to help those families as they deal with the complex situation.

- Audio and/or videotaping is not permitted.

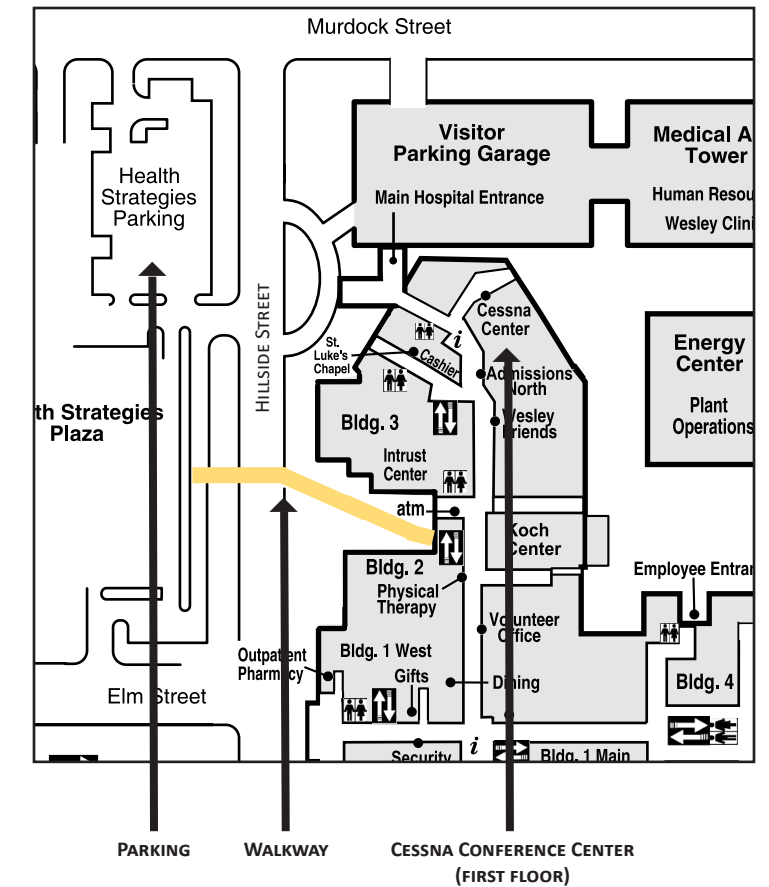
Location and Parking
