

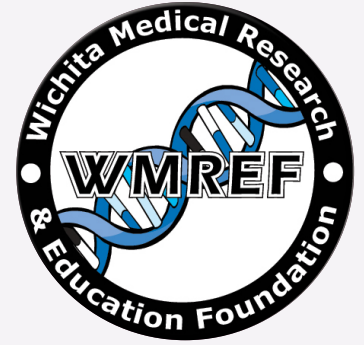
40TH ANNUAL GORE-FARHA CRITICAL CARE NURSING SYMPOSIUM

WELCOME

This 2-day Symposium is designed for critical care nurses, as well as other nurses and allied health professionals, desiring to enhance their critical care nursing knowledge base. An outstanding group of national and local speakers with critical care expertise comprise the faculty.



OBJECTIVES

THURSDAY, APRIL 28

- Discuss how capnography can reflect a patient at risk for oversedation.
- Describe how pulse oximetry is able to identify threats to pulmonary function.
- Discuss burnout, early warning signs, and evidenced-based strategies to reverse burnout and cope with the many challenging rigors of critical care nursing in the 21st century and in the midst of the global pandemic.
- Explain and analyze current recommendations for the diagnosis and treatment of VAP, CAP/HAP, UTI, and bloodstream infections.
- Describe the prevalence of HAIs and MDROs in the acute care setting and how this influences antibiotic prescribing practices.
- Identify and describe appropriate, best available resuscitation strategies for stable and unstable adult polytrauma patients.
- Describe evolving, up-to-date trends in the management and care of the complicated adult multisystem trauma patient in critical care.
- Examine clinical cases in the ICU for the presence of ethical conflict or compromise.
- Apply concepts to minimize conflict among providers/patients/families while respecting one another's values and professional duties.

FRIDAY, APRIL 29

- Discuss patient selection for post-arrest TTM in context of the TTM2 trial.
- Discuss cardiac and neurologic management of patients after cardiac arrest resuscitation.
- Explore strategies for creating a growth mentality, staying passionate, staying focused, and performing optimally when everything around us seems to be falling apart.
- Describe why stroke volume optimization can improve patient outcome.
- Describe how occult hypoperfusion can occur in the presence of normal vital signs and urine output.
- Identify the reason sepsis is one of the most important public health issues.
- Discuss the key components of sepsis treatment.
- Understand the difference between tradition-based care and evidence-based practice.
- Identify ICU specific tradition-based care measures and learn evidence-based care replacements.
